



Bernice Eisenberg passed away peacefully Friday morning, September 7, 2018. Bernice (Bonnie) Eisenberg was born in Chicago, Illinois on January 15, 1924. She was the second daughter of Israel (Jos) and Sylvia Cohen. Bonnie graduated high school in 1942. As a young lady, she moved to Phoenix, Arizona for a period of one year where she was a member of the USO Club. Bonnie married George Eisenberg on November 28, 1943, in Salt Lake City, Utah while George was in the Army. After George was honorably discharged from the service, they made their home in Denver, Colorado where George started his Geo. Eisenberg & Co. construction company in 1952 where Bonnie worked as vice president. Bonnie worked for a number of U.S. Government agencies during her thirty-two-year career as a government employee. In 1982 Bonnie and George retired at the ages of 58. They did a lot of traveling North America and Mexico as well as overseas. Bonnie and George belonged to a number of clubs around the Denver area. They were members of The Early Ford V8 Club, Rocky Mountain Thunderbird Club,

and Classic Lincoln Car Club. They also shared a love for airplanes. They each had their private pilot's license and loved to fly single-engine airplanes but also enjoyed model airplanes.

Bonnie is survived by her sister, Vivian Mitofsky of Chicago, four nieces and great-nephews and nieces. She is also survived by special RMTC friends, Mike and Tenel Ashcraft. Bonnie was preceded in death by her husband, George, in 2009, her parents and her older sister, Eleanor. Bonnie will be laid to rest with George at Fort Logan National Cemetery.


